Collaboration between Indigenous and Non-Indigenous

Specific to the implementation of Coordinated Access and an HMIS, has there been collaboration between the Designated Community (DC) Community Entity (CE) and local Indigenous organizations?

Describe how this collaboration was done and how it affected the implementation of Coordinated Access. How will it be strengthened in the future?

Indigenous community partners have worked closely with Coordinated Access. We have supported the implementation of Coordinated Access and HIFIS with our Indigenous partners. Our Indigenous partners have a Gitwetashkad Indigenous Homelessness Plan Strategic Plan which was endorsed by Coordinated Access. Stability Services references in any strategic implementation for Coordinated Access and HIFIS. Stability Services are looking to support an inclusive housing assessment system of new participants in Coordinated Access (for example, a culturally safe housing assessment to support the VI-SPDAT assessment). Stability Services will continue to work closely with our Indigenous partners to increase support for the new Indigenous housing units that will be matched through Coordinated Access. The Indigenous community will also be prioritized when bringing new affordable housing units online through Coordinated Access.

Coordinated Access has worked collaboratively with local Indigenous organizations in order to provide support for individuals who identify as Indigenous for culturally appropriate housing supports. Coordinated Access also supported the development of Indigenous-led training sessions. Local Indigenous organizations include the Housing Prevention Network, a group of organizations who use HMIS.

The City of London's Coordinated Access System is striving to achieve the Reaching Home collaboratively with Leaders in a multi-sectoral approach to solving chronic homelessness. The City continues to work with Built for Zero Canada to ensure all minimum guideline requirements are met through engagement meetings. Currently, London's Coordinated Access is working on reviewing and updating procedure documentation to ensure it is in accordance with Reaching Home and Built for Zero. London's Coordinated Access supports a yearly prioritization meeting to review and generate a list of housing resources administered to meet the needs of Londoners. Ongoing governance and reporting for the Coordinated Access system are brought forward to the London Homeless Prevention Network. The City has increased its service delivery by hiring two full-time Client Service Representatives and is working to actively prevent and divert homelessness where possible and strive to make the most of the resources available by connecting individuals and families to housing services.
