Project Overview

The Project



The RentSmart: Preventing Homelessness Project expanded the RentSmart model for successful tenancies from BC to Alberta and Manitoba through curriculum adaptations and RentSmart Educator Train the Trainer (TTT) sessions, the project engaged new and existing community partners and program participants.




The project included curriculum adaptations to meet the needs of Indigenous communities, people exiting Corrections, and people transitioning from shelters to housing.

What We Achieved

- 6 TTTs in Alberta trained 73 Educators from 40 organizations
- 2 TTT in Manitoba trained 36 Educators from 30 organizations
- 665 people in BC, Alberta and Manitoba received RentSmart Education and Support





What We Learned

- There is an interest in proactive and capacity building solutions for vulnerable populations
- Education needs to be delivered in a variety of different contexts in a variety of different learner formats.
- Online education is an important part of the puzzle yet it can be expensive to develop in a way that mirrors the high interaction of in-person education.
- The adaptation process needs to include time for initial adaptation, testing and integration of learning.


Too often, people are in crisis and at risk of losing housing or are homeless before accessing help. There are well documented reasons for why people lose their housing, and evictions have been proven to be a contributing factor to homelessness. RentSmart is a program that is designed to get in front of crisis' and build the skills, knowledge and confidence for people to find and keep their housing. It has been proven to work and can be implemented by community organizations and housing providers. To date, over 55 communities across Canada have invited RentSmart to be a part of their housing solution.












