


TABLE NOTES:

- * SUPPORTIVE HOUSING The Supportive Housing data (the number of spaces and the waiting list) is not reported on this year as the supportive housing waiting list is being integrated into the Social Housing Registry.
- ** SHELTER USE DATA The City has now revised shelter use and length of stay figures upward for 2007 and 2008 as a result of revisions in their methodology which are intended to produce more accurate data. Beginning in 2009, the City of Ottawa is using a fully electronic system to summarize shelter data to further increase accuracy. Last year we were provided totals for unique individuals using the shelter system of 6,572 for 2007 and 7,045 for 2008; that data was gathered together in one report using a more 'manual' method. In this table, we have adjusted numbers for the previous 2004-2006 report card data on homelessness indicators, calculating from differences in the 2007 and 2008 numbers provided by the City of Ottawa.
